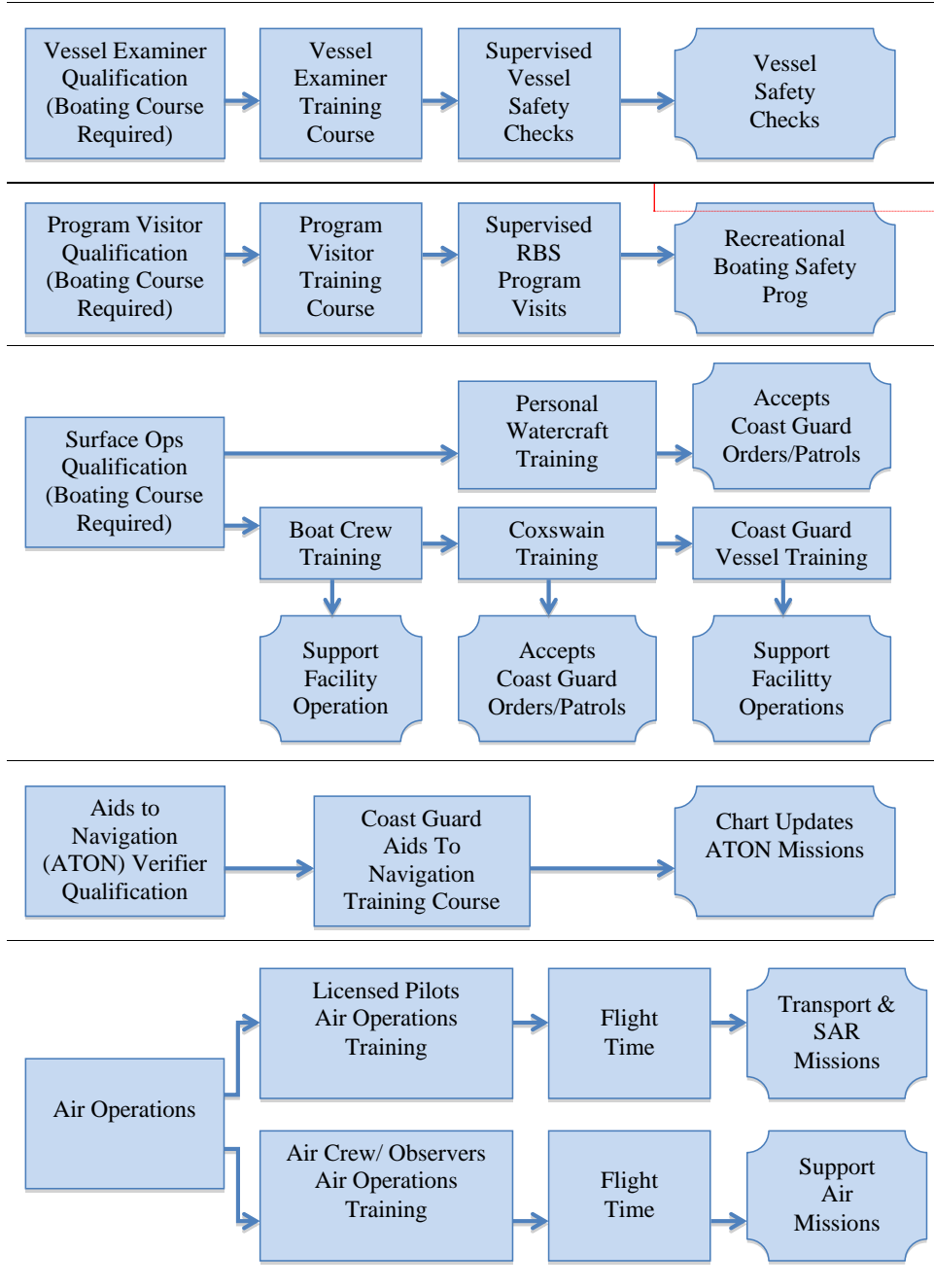

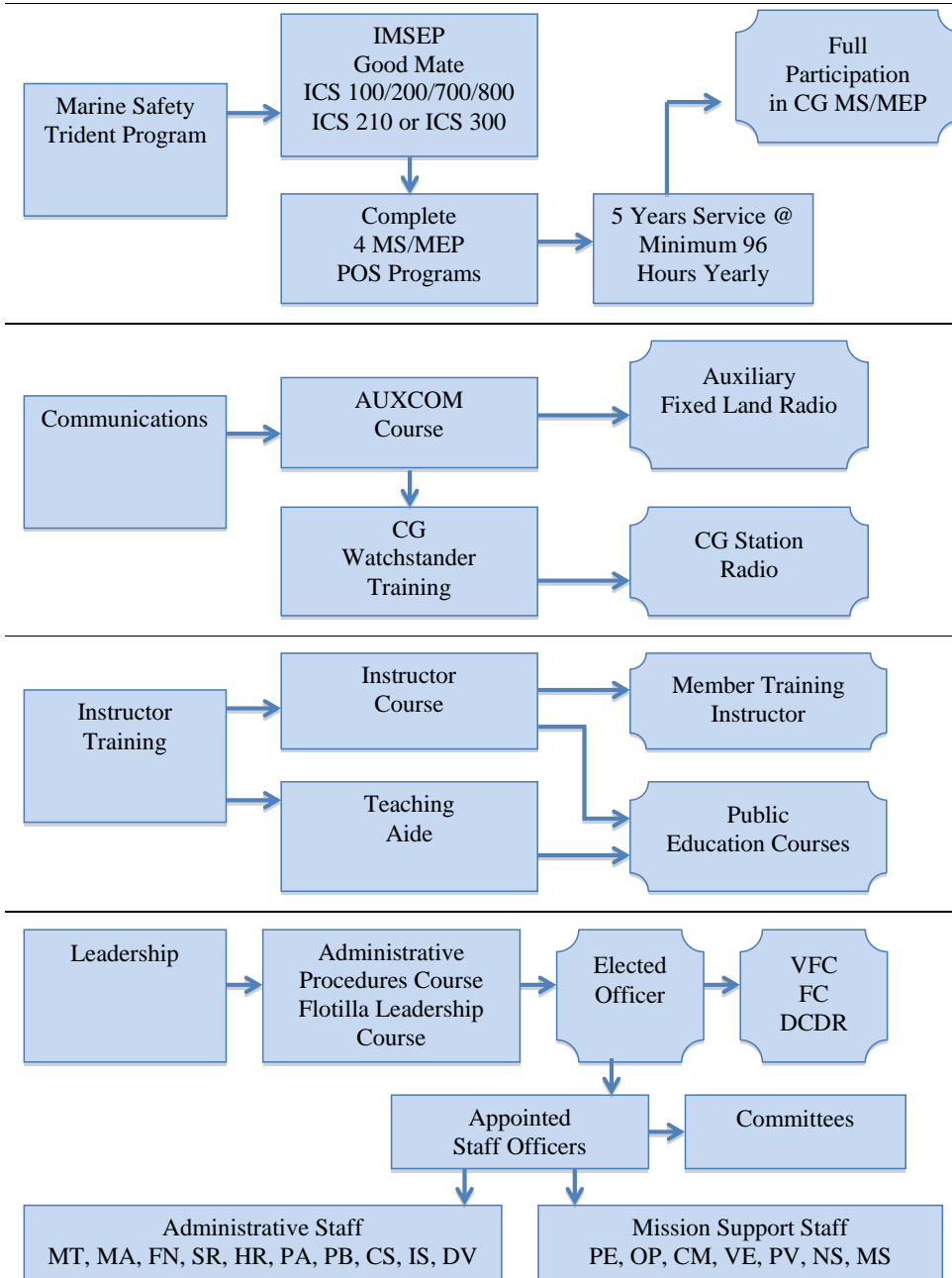
Comment [REH3]: Since RBS is really "what we do" for the Coast Guard, it seems this should be expanded and include PE, VE, etc.
