## **Division One AUXNET Script**

**1: Start the net on time, so make sure that your timepiece is accurate.**

**2: Wait 1 sec. after keying the mic before talking, and unkey after each BREAK.**

**3: Do not unkey the mic unless you've just said BREAK, OVER or OUT.**

**4: Download the latest script from the Division 1 website.**

**At 1920 make this announcement:**

“Hello all stations. This is Coast Guard Auxiliary Radio (your call sign). The Coast Guard Auxiliary Sector San Diego Net will begin at 1930 hours local on repeater Yankee Sierra Delta. Please join us. (your call sign) OUT.

**At 1930 begin the net.**

“Hello all stations, hello all stations.

This is Coast Guard Auxiliary Radio (your call sign), net control for tonight's Sector San Diego Net on repeater Yankee Sierra Delta. Today's date is (state the date). This net meets each Wednesday at 1930 hours to exchange information regarding Auxiliary activities. This is a directed net that is controlled by a qualified Auxiliary radio operator.

Net control is responsible for these key duties:

- Controlling the priority and timing of all radio transmissions.
- Setting the duration of the net activity.
- Efficiently handling multiple requests and situations.
- Logging the events of the net.
- Reporting the results to the Chain of Leadership.

**BREAK**

“Net Control will call for specific call signs. Auxiliary radio operators should check in when they are called or during one of the periods where late or missed stations are called for. Stations must be correctly acknowledged by Net Control before transmitting further. Do not respond out of sequence.

“Remember, at all times priority must be provided to distress, life and safety or other emergency traffic. Keep your transmissions short to allow priority traffic to break in. This is Net Control calling any station with emergency or priority traffic, OVER”

*Acknowledge any stations that respond.*

“This is Net Control calling stations with routine traffic or announcements for the net, call signs only please, you will be recalled in order, over.”

*If nobody responds move on to Flotilla check-ins.*

*Recall any stations with traffic. Here is an example:*

*“Call sign, this is net control. Send your traffic, over.”*

*After their traffic is sent, respond with:*

*“Call sign, ROGER. Are there any questions or comments on the foregoing, over?”*

*Use the proword “OUT” when responding to a station and no reply is expected.*

*For example, after station “ZZ” has replied, respond with “ZZ roger, thanks for checking in, OUT”.*

### Flotilla Check-ins

“This is Net Control. Roll call follows by flotilla. Please respond when your call sign is called, and add your station's radio type, power source and your current location.”

“Calling stations in flotilla **one one** for check-in, starting with XN, over.”

*Continue with this list of previous check-ins: GR, KW, ZU, BC, DD, TT*

“Are there any (additional) check-ins from flotilla **one one**, over?”

“Flotilla **one four** for check-in, starting with XO, over.”

“Are there any (additional) check-ins from flotilla **one four**, over?”

“Flotilla **one five** for check-in, starting with DF, over.”

*Continue with this list of previous check-ins: NC, RV, SE, RS, NB, CS, DQ, KU*

“Are there any (additional) check-ins from flotilla **one five**, over?”

“Flotilla **one six** for check-in, starting with GU, over.”

*Continue with this list of previous check-ins:*

“Are there any (additional) check-ins from flotilla **one six**, over?”

“Flotilla **one nine** for check-in, starting with PB, over.”

*Continue with this list of previous check-ins: DY*

“Are there any (additional) check-ins from flotilla **one nine**, over?”

“Flotilla **one ten** for check-in, starting with FG, over.”

*Continue with this list of previous check-ins: JL*

“Are there any additional check-ins from flotilla **one ten**, over?”

“Calling stations late or missed, from any Division 1 flotilla for check-in, over.”

“Calling stations from any District Eleven flotilla for check-in, over.”

“Calling stations with late traffic for the net, call signs only please, over.”

“This is United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Radio Station (your call sign) securing the Net at \_\_\_\_\_ hours. The repeater is now open for general use.

Thank you for participating, out.”
