Randall Ellington joined the Office of Auxiliary & Boating Safety at Coast Guard Headquarters as the Budget and Finance Manager in May 2024. Born and raised primarily in Fayetteville, NC, he graduated cum laude from North Carolina A&T State University in 2008 with a BA in Communications.

After working as an Internal Sales Representative for Lincoln Financial Group in Radnor, PA, he transitioned to the Army's Comptroller Intern Program in 2009. The program provided new Army finance civilians with several job placements over two years, along with a host of training opportunities. As an intern, he was first assigned to Installation Management at Ft. Stewart, GA, where he gained vital experience supporting Army families at the largest Army base east of the Mississippi River. During his time as an intern, Randall supported financial operations at Arlington National Cemetery, the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command, and Ft. Gregg-Adams. As the capstone to his internship, Randall attended the Army Comptroller Course, a two-week intensive program hosted at Syracuse University.



Upon completing of internship and working in support of The Old Guard, Randall deployed to Kuwait as an Army civilian in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF). During his 16-month assignment, he helped execute a budget more than \$300M while serving as the Deputy Budget Officer. While in Kuwait, he had the opportunity to work side by side with contractors, active duty, and reserve soldiers. He also trained several waves of personnel assigned to OEF.

After returning Stateside, he went on to support the execution of the Military's Intelligence Program with Army G2 at The Pentagon. While working in the G2, he was able to support the Counterintelligence Directorate. This opportunity allowed him to execute funding from both the National Intelligence Program (NIP) as well as the Military Intelligence Program (MIP).

After leaving the Pentagon, he had to opportunity to serve at our Nation's Most Hallowed Ground, Arlington National Cemetery (ANC). At ANC, he was able to work with funding that was authorized by Congress for use specifically at the cemetery. During this period, the cemetery was carrying out its largest expansion in the last 50 years.

Aside from his duties as a Budget Analyst, Randall is a fitness enthusiast. He frequently tries to hit at least 20,000 steps per day and drink at least a gallon of water. He lives in Washington, D.C. with his family.
